

What is FATIMA?

FATIMA is an animated documentary that tells the story of my mother, Fatima Jam, and her childhood during the Lebanon-Israel war and the Israeli occupation of South Lebanon. It is set in Tyre, Lebanon, from 1978 to 1990. Through Fatima's eyes, we experience her formative years, filled with sorrow but also moments of beauty.

In times like these, it is crucial to tell stories from the Middle East, giving the victims of war a face and a voice while shedding light on their experiences.

The film will have a length of 10 minutes, is entirely hand-drawn, and will be completed in the third quater of 2025. Watch the final teaser here and feel free to reach out for the current stage of the film:

Faithful to History and Family Records

In this film, we place great importance on historically accurate events and the experiences of my family. We work with historical sources and images to accurately tell the story of my mother, with whom I also co - wrote the script. Here you can see some of the images from our family archive, which we use as a reference. My mother's story includes the first bombardment of Tyre in 1978, the invasion of southern Lebanon, the tragic death of her mother, the abduction of her brother, and other pivotal moments in her life, leading up to her escape to Germany.
















The Director
